## National Technical Honor Society (NTHS)

National Technical Honor Society is designed to reward meritorious achievement in technical education. It is also geared toward encouraging and assisting technical students in their pursuit of educational and career goals. All full-time students enrolled at SWGTC are eligible for membership in the NTHS. The following requirements for membership must be maintained: 1. Must have completed one semester in attendance; 2. Minimum GPA of 3.75 for the semester in which nominated and must maintain cumulative GPA of 3.30; and 3. Must not have more than 4 days of absence per semester.
